# CONSULTATION ON QUALIFICATIONS FOR ESCORT DRIVERS AND MANAGERS

At the end of January letters referring to the two City & Guild qualifications (Level 2 and Level 3) were forwarded for Consultation to transport organisations (Road Skills for Logistics, ACPO, Police Scotland, Highways Agency, AIRSO, FTA, RHA, RHA Caravan Hauliers Group, RHA Heavy Haulage Group, URTU, UNISON, UNITE, TSSA, NFU, CPA, the army ESTA, International Road Transport Union (IRU), the Secretary of State for Transport, amongst others.


Responses received are being collated and the comments taken into consideration. Responses received so far have been encouraging. The consultation will be discussed at the HTA meeting on 6th March 2014.



The recent case of an HGV driver who was banned from driving an HGV for 21 days for using a mobile phone whilst at the wheel, is a reminder that driving while using a handheld device is an offence. Traffic Commissioners take a dim view of those driving whilst holding a hand held device as in doing so a driver cannot be in proper control of the vehicle and this will significantly compromise road safety.
